

Executive Summary

To respond to the COVID -19 crisis, OATH positioned itself right from the start of the crisis. This report represents the progress made under the PPI's funded project (HELP II) from September to October 2021 to support 200 most deserving families through Churches in Khyber Pakhtun.

COVID -19 was declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern on 30 January 2020 (WHO), since then the number of cases continues to soar around the world. The COVID -19 pandemic has pushed millions of households into poverty and substantially increased income and wealth inequality in Pakistan. This situation poses a serious near-term challenge for poor communities, especially since rising food and commodity prices compound social and economic insecurities.

Pakistani Christian community is among the poorest and hardest hit by the economic slowdown and subsequent lockdown, starting from early March 2020 until Mid-July. The COVID -19 emergency has deprived low-income Christians and non-Christian households of their already meager livelihoods and has forced them to live through the crisis in extremely cramped and overcrowded settlements with literally no ventilation and poor hygiene conditions. A large number of the population is living in concentrated settlements where in one building 3 or more families are living together and one room is used by 3 to 5 people that increased probability of virus spread. COVID -19 has shattered the economic outlook of the Christian communities in Pakistan. It has exposed the vulnerability. poverty, and underdevelopment of Christians in the country. The effect of COVID -19 on Christians in Pakistan is drastic while the long-term impacts are yet to be evaluated.

Vulnerable families badly affected by COVID -19 were reached with cash assistance of COVID -19 awareness and Rs. 10,000 / per family in district Peshawar, Bannu, Karak, and Abbottabad of province KPK, Pakistan. Project interventions were carried out in partnership with Diocese of Peshawar, Catholic Church Peshawar, Assemblies of God, Agape Trust, Kingdom of God Church and Youth With A Mission.

Project Description

To ensure the COVID-19 pandemic and its economic consequences do not have long-lasting and disproportionate effects on Pakistan's Christian community, a project titled "HELP II" was launched in October 2021. The project mainly intended to support the most vulnerable and deserving families affected by the third wave of COVID-19 through cash grants; secondly, the project aimed to strengthening the capacities of the local emerging humanitarian actors in order to increase the local humanitarian capacities.

Through this project, overall 1200 families were supported through cash grants of PKR 10000/- per family. OATH assisted 200 families in Peshawar, Bannu, Karak, and Abbottabad.

Cost

The total cost of the project was PKR 2,750,000/-Project efficiency is remarkable as 73% of the total cost directly went to beneficiaries as cash relief and 05% spent on awareness raising campaign.








Religion wise breakdown



Human Interest Story



Ms. Shazia (Village Swati, Peshawar)

Ms. Shazia resident of a small village Swati, Peshawar; use to sew at her house. Most of her clients are ladies from neighborhood. Despite her physical disability she earns for her father, brothers and their children. When COVID-19 disturbed the lives by restricting everyone in houses, her work was badly affected. Even after passing two years, she is not getting much work to do.

"We live in a small village which is not easily accessible. Few months back we received small amount of food from someone but never received grant to fulfil our needs properly." Says Shazia. I am thankful to have the support as this helped me to enhance my work reconnecting to my clients. My entire family is impressed by the compassion showed by the Church to us.



Mr. Faryad Masih (Karak, KPK)

The Christian community of Karak is living under the poverty line, mostly families have taken loans on interest and after the years they were unable to pay back the loan and increasing interest is becoming a curse for them. The lenders have taken their checkbooks and the whole salary of borrower goes to the pocket of lenders as a recovery of the loans. In COVID-19 the situation got worse for many families who lost their part-time jobs.

Mr. Faryad Masih, a local social worker shared his pain about the community who are burdened of debt. He was joyful to know that Karak Christian community will be fully covered and facilitated with the provision of cash grants of 10,000. He shared that although this is very small amount considering their needs but this will bring comfort to their lives. While sharing he suggested that provision of grant is relevant but there is need to introduce few projects to uplift the economic situation of poor Christian community. He requested to convey his message to donors to invest in Karak.
